



- Hungary (NW)
- Serbia (SW)
- Bulgaria (S)
- Ukraine (N and E)
- Republic of Moldova (E and NE)





Romania facts: People

- Population: 19,334,000 (October 1, 2016)
- Capital city: Bucharest (2.1 million)
- 320 towns and cities (19 > 100,000)
- 12,921 villages (2,854 communes)
- Median age: 42.5 years (vs 40.8 Canada)
- Urban population: 60.8% (vs 82% Canada)




Romania facts: People

- Main ethnic groups: Romanian - 88.9% Hungarian & Szekely - 6.5% Gypsy - 3.2% German, Serbian, Turkish, Ukrainian - 1.4%
- National Language: Romanian (Latin rooths) (Hungarian is spoken by about 7% of Romania's population)

 Religions: Greek Orthodox (82%), Roman –Catholic (4.3%), Calvinist (3%), Greek – Catholic (3%), Pentecost (1.7%)

Romania: Visitor Info

Currency: Romanian Leu (plural: Lei)

(Pronunciation: Lay / Abbreviation: LEI or RON)

- No visa for Canadian, U.S., Australian citizens,
- Romania is not part of the Schenghen Area however, Schengen visa is accepted,
- No immunizations or 'Departure Tax',
- Canadian / U.S. drivers license valid for 90 days.

Romania: Visitor Info

 Climate: temperate continental, with four distinct seasons; April through October, the most popular,

- English is spoken by about 35% of Romania's population
- Time zone: Eastern Europe time (GMT + 2)
 Seven hours ahead of Canada Eastern Time Zone

Romania: Government / International Relations

Republic with two legislative bodies (Senate & Chamber of Representatives).

- NATO member (2004),
- European Union (2007),

Excellent diplomatic relations with both

Canada and the United States of America


Romania: Air Transportation

- 16 Major Airports (14 international) (Bucharest, Cluj, Timisoara, Iasi, Bacau, Targu Mures, Sibiu, Craiova are the largest)
- Non-Stop flights from/ to all main European cities, operated by major European airlines as well as European budget airlines: *Air Berlin, Blue Air, Ryan Air, Vueling, Wizz Air.*
- Domestic flights from Bucharest to: Cluj, Iasi, Oradea, Sibiu, Suceava, Timisoara (mostly business travelers, small planes).



Romania: Train Transportation

- Direct international train service to / from: Austria, Bulgaria, Hungary, Republic of Moldova, Turkey, Ukraine.
 Trains are safe, reliable and offer travelers the opportunity to admire the various, beautiful Romanian landscapes ...
- Express and local trains connect Romania's main cities, (most routes travel south to north / north to south). Train tickets are available on-line & inexpensive:
- Bucharest to Brasov: 70 Lei (1st class, reserved seat)
- Brasov to Sibiu: 64 Lei (1st class, reserved seat)
- Bucharest to Suceava: 92 Lei / 293 Lei (2nd class / single sleeper)

 Built 1875 – 1914 (German neo-Renaissance)
 160 rooms, great variety of decoration styles
 (Gothic, German Renaissance, Florentine, Turkish)

Bran (Dracula) Castle – mid 1300s
 Association with the legend of Count Dracula,
 Romania's most visited museum.

Southern Transylvania: Brasov – Sibiu – Sighisoara

- Brasov, Main city in Southern Transylvania Highlights: The Old Saxon Town, The Black Church, The Town Square, The Blacksmith's Bastion & the City Archives, great hiking.
- Sibiu, Medieval town built by Saxons (early 1200s), great museums including Brukenthal
- Sighisoara "One of the best preserved medieval towns in Europe" (several travel guides)














Bucovina NW Romania – The Painted Monasteries

- World Heritage Sites, Protected by UNESCO
- "Albums of Fresco Art" (15th and 16th centuries)
- Original way of depicting beliefs or events: Sucevita, "Ladder of Virtue";
 - Humor, the devil amusingly depicted as a woman; Voronet, *The Last Judgment*.
- These monasteries remain active, visitors might chance on a service where the high voices of nuns sing in response to the chanting of the priest.
- Colorful and detail-rich (interior and exterior) frescoes: prayers, episodes of sacred hymns and themes, imagery of biblical scenes, apostles, evangelists, martyrs, angels and demons.























Maramures (NW Romania)

Very rural, quaint and charming villages, friendly locals, colorful festive wear, well preserved traditional architecture and traditions

- Wooden architecture: Gates & Churches (UNESCO)
- The Merry Cemetery
- Over 300 (local) festivals annually


















The Danube Delta (SE Romania)

Third largest biodiversity in the world (over 5,500 flora and fauna species), exceeded only by the Great Barrier Reef in Australia and the Galapagos Archipelago in Ecuador.

- Bird / wildlife-watching,
- Canoeing kayaking,
- Eco-tours.














The Carpathian Mountains (Central Romania)

- 28% of Romania's territory,
- 14 National Parks and 18 major Nature Reserves,
- Europe's last undisturbed forests,













WINE MAP OF ROMANIA


